



## Vape Reduction Plan

This August KCCC began using vape detectors in all student restrooms and locker rooms in building 1 and both locker rooms in building 4. The detectors sense when the chemicals associated with vaping are in the air. The sensors will also detect elevated noise levels indicating a potential bullying situation as well as sense attempts to tamper with the system. All detections will send text notifications for prompt follow-up.

The KCCC discipline process is cumulative. Based on the student's discipline history, steps in the below process may be skipped.

Any vape containing a controlled substance (like THC or others) will be addressed with our discipline plan for drug use.

### 1st Offense

- 3 Days CAP
- Students will be assigned Vape Educate course modules while in CAP
  - Must complete (and pass) before returning to classes
- Students will be referred to the school nurse for additional resources
  - My Life, My Quit resources provided
    - Provided by the Ohio Department of Health

### 2nd Offense

- 3 Days OSS
- Students will be assigned to attend the Freedom Center tobacco cessation program
  - The program must be paid for by the family
    - Cost - \$20
  - The suspension will be reduced to 1 day if the student shows proof of completion of the program within the assigned time frame
  - If the student does not attend the program they will be assigned the remaining 2 days of the suspension for "failure to serve other school discipline"

### 3rd Offense

- 5 Days OSS
- Students will be referred to school counseling

### 4th Offense

- 10 Days OSS
- Students will be required to show proof of outside addiction counseling, paid for by the family

### 5th Offense

- 10 Days OSS and Recommended For Removal from KCCC
