

Student Appearance Uniforms

POLICY

The primary responsibility for a student's attire resides with the student and the student's parent(s).

The District is responsible for seeing that student attire does not interfere with the health or safety of any student, that student attire does not contribute to a hostile or intimidating atmosphere for any student, and that dress code enforcement does not reinforce or increase marginalization or oppression of any group based on race, sex, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, ethnicity, religion, cultural observance, household income, or body type/size.

Any restrictions to the way a student dresses must be necessary to support the overall educational goals of the school and must be consistent with this policy on student appearance.

~~Principals may request the use of specific school dress colors for student clothing in their respective building if there is parental support. In addition, the Board of Education may mandate the wearing of uniforms in any school building, upon a majority vote of the Board.~~
