Advanced Placement:

- 117 seniors, representing 60.26% of the class of 2022, completed at least one AP course in their high school career.
- 98 seniors (51.3% of the class) took 2 or more and 82 seniors (43% of the class) took 3 or more AP courses.
- A total of 663 AP exams were administered in 2022.
- The average score on all exams was 3.2, and 73% of all scores were 3 or higher.

College Level Courses:

- 173 students (90.6% of the class) took at least one CL course in their HS career.
- 164 students (86% of the class) took at least 2 CL courses.
- 150 students (78.5% of the class) took at least 3 CL courses.

Diploma Designations:

- 68 seniors (35.6% of the class) earned a Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation with Honors.
- 77 seniors (40.3% of the class) earned a Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation.
- 39 seniors (20.4% of the class) earned a Regents Diploma, and 1 student earned a Regents Diploma with Honors.
- Overall, 185 seniors (96.86% of the class) earned at least a Regents Diploma.
