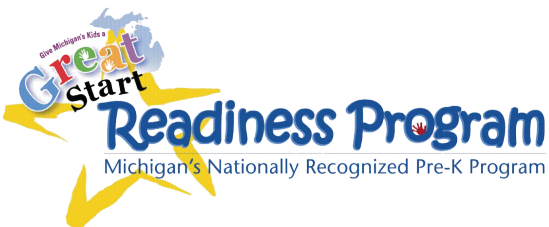

Children with any of the following factors will be considered for the program:

- Your child has a developmental delay.
- Your child has challenging behavior.
- Your child's primary language is not English.
- You do not have a high school diploma or GED.
- Your child has experienced abuse/neglect or there is domestic violence in the home.
- Environmental risk factor(s) are present in the home.

The Great Start Readiness Program is a **tuition-FREE Preschool** that prepares children for kindergarten. Eligible students are children living in Monroe County who attain age 4 by September 1st of the current school year.*

This high-quality preschool program explores the content areas of literacy, math, science, and social studies through active learning experiences. Children develop language and problem-solving skills through peer interactions and play. The curriculum is aligned with the Early Childhood Standards of Quality for Pre-kindergarten.

The **Great Start Readiness Program** is funded by a grant from the Michigan Department of Education. The State has identified factors that may affect your child's education at any time in his/her kindergarten through 12th grade school career.
