I have submitted pricing for the 2020-2021 budget for three new buses. The trade values for used school buses is not what we are used to. Leonards Bus will give us a trade price for our used buses but have recommended that we consider using an auction web site to get a better price.

We are still looking for a full-time school bus driver. We have had to alter bus runs to compensate for illness and delay leave times for sporting events.

Winter Sports are in full swing. Winter weather cannot make up its mind whether to stay or not.

We have had a stretch of bad luck with two buses developing a crack in the windshield. Both windshields have been replaced by the bus dealer Leonard Bus.

Next DOT Inspection will be in February 2020.

This month we completed our usual number of work orders - mostly plumbing and door repairs.

We swapped out the batteries in the generator while Milton Caterpillar was here so that they were certified during their inspection. The cost saving on this was quite significant. They charge also \$1,000. for the batteries and we purchased and installed them for under \$200. We swapped out another set of batteries in another fire panel. It's a newer process, but far less expensive than we do it rather than Simplex/ Johnson Controls.

We made a few repairs to our floor machines. We had a couple breakdowns in the last month. Thankfully, we were able to fix the issues without much problem.

There were a number of heaters in the 7th and 8th grade wing that had issues - most were dry-rotted air lines or bad thermostats, all of which we fixed. There was one digital control issue in the boys' locker room that we called Upstate Temperature Control in on. Also, a sensor failed in a ceiling uni-vent. We installed 4 more gym replacement lights in the gym over Christmas break.

This past weekend on Sunday around 4:00 am, we had a major issue with the steam boiler system. Fortunately, Rose Boyer heard the boiler alarm during her building check and made the appropriate phone calls. A chemical injector point that Chem Aqua installed to feed chemical into the make-up water loop failed, draining the entire steam boiler system. The boilers shut down on safety, (as they should), dumping between 2,000 and 3,000 gallons of steaming hot water, ruining our high temperature sump pump. By the time we got here and shut the make-up water pumps down, we ended up losing a make-up water pump. To compound the matter, when the pump had issues, it caused every fuse in the control panel to blow. After a number of hours of work and troubleshooting, we got one boiler up and running along with a new sump pump installed.

This morning, January 15, we will install the new feed pump and hopefully by Friday, we will have installed check valves on these boiler feed lines to prevent this from ever happening again.
